



Executive Summary

Under the patronage of His Highness Sheikh Khaled bin Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Chairman of the Executive Council of Abu Dhabi, the 2nd edition of the WorldSkills Asia Competition was hosted by Abu Dhabi from 27th to 29th November 2023 at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre (ADNEC). This event, organized by the Abu Dhabi Centre for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (ACTVET), marked a significant milestone in the realm of Technical and Vocational skills across Asia.

Over 6000 visitors, with the participation of 670 individuals, including competitors, experts, and workshop managers from 31 countries, the competition showcased excellence in 28 technical and vocational skills. 

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



WorldSkills Asia Abu Dhabi 2023 in Numbers





























Host City - Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi hosted the WorldSkills Asia Competition for the 2nd time in November 2023, the first one being in 2018.

Abu Dhabi is a diverse and globally connected city; the capital of the United Arab Emirates is home to more than 200 nationalities. It is an aspiring global financial centre, a growing innovation hub, a leading energy producer, and a world-class tourist destination and cultural centre. Abu Dhabi is the largest emirate in the UAE and is divided into three regions: Abu Dhabi City on the coast, Al Ain in the east, and Al Dhafra in the west.

Abu Dhabi City is the commercial and cultural centre of the emirate. Located on the coast of the Arabian Gulf, it encompasses several islands, including Yas Island - a world-class entertainment destination, and Saadiyat Island - renowned for its cultural attractions, including Louvre Abu Dhabi.





Welcoming Member and Guest Countries

At the heart of any global competition lies the crucial task of extending a warm and organized welcome to all participants, whether competitors, delegates, partners, sponsors, country representatives, ministers, or visitors, everyone was treated with exemplary hospitality to create a lasting and positive impression. Introducing guests to the Emirati traditions and culture was integral to the event's success.

Delegates arriving at the Abu Dhabi and Dubai International Airports were greeted by dedicated country guides, ensuring a seamless transition from arrival to accommodation, and throughout the competition. Safety and satisfaction of our guests were given top priority, and to achieve this, robust procedures and protocols were implemented to promtly address any concerns or requests raised by the delegates and participants.

Accreditation

Accreditation procedure was marked by issuance of badges with essential details, including a photo, name, country, role, permitted access, and QR code for floor map, event agenda and other information. A dedicated Registration desk, handled by our team was set up at the accommodations and onsite, ensuring needed information was shared with the participants.

A "Welcome Pack" featuring exclusive WorldSkills Asia branded items such as watches, diaries, scarves, ties, water flasks, and portable chargers were also handed to the participants.

















Accommodation

Participants were offered a range of options and flexibility in choosing their accommodation, with the Vocational Education Development Centre (VEDC) and Abu Dhabi Hotels serving as designated facilities for their six-night stay for the competition.



Vocational Education Development Centre (VEDC)

Extensive preparations a month before the event were undertaken to transform the building into well-arranged accommodation. The threestory structure included a reception, operation rooms, storerooms, dining areas, and guest accommodations with rooms, washrooms, and a majlis. Daily maintenance aimed at providing utmost comfort and a positive experience to our 109 guests in 45 rooms.




Hotel Accommodation

Hotels, strategically located near the venue and in the city center, were carefully chosen keeping convenience and budget in mind.

In total, there were 273 single rooms and 128 twin rooms booked for international and local participants.



Catering

In consideration of the participants' diverse eating habits, cultural preferences, and specific food restrictions and dietary requirements, catering services were tailored to accommodate these varied needs. Delegates accommodated at VEDC were provided with daily breakfast and dinner. Meanwhile, those staying in hotels enjoyed complimentary daily breakfast as part of their accommodation package. Additionally, lunch was provided to all participants at the ADNEC.

Water, coffee breaks, and snacks were strategically placed in every skill area, meeting, and conference rooms, as well as media rooms throughout the competition days and the Closing Ceremony.


Transportation & Logistics



Excursions across Abu Dhabi provided participants with a unique opportunity to explore the local culture, heritage, and landscapes. The journey commenced with a cultural exploration at Sheikh Zayad Grand Mosque, providing an understanding of its rich heritage and traditions. Following this, participants chose their preferred destinations, with options including Emirates Heritage Village, Qasr Al Hosn, Yas Mall, and Louvre Abu Dhabi. Delegates made their selections by registering through an online weblink weeks before arriving in the UAE.

Test Projects and Evaluation

In every WorldSkills Asia competition, Experts, as specified in Technical Description, formulate a Test Project for each skill. The Technical Description outlines the specific details and requirements of the test project. The Test Project is governed by a set of rules designed to ensure a fair and competitive environment. Competitors must strictly adhere to project guidelines, encompassing specifics on tool usage, time constraints, and deliverables. WorldSkills Asia Abu Dhabi 2023 adopted the Test Projects from the WorldSkills Competition 2022 Special Edition.



Each Test Project was accompanied by a marking scheme matching the assessment criteria as given in the Technical Description. The assessment criteria vary depending on the specific skill and generally cover a range of technical, problemsolving, creativity, and personal skills. Experts used Competition Information System (CIS) to objectively assess each competitor's performance. For fair and consistent assessments, the scoring system was designed with the use of scoring rubrics and predefined criteria to assign scores to the competitors.

This prestigious award was won by an Emirati competitor, Ahmed Saleh Ahmed Mohamed Basahel competing in the Automobile Technology




From Abu Dhabi to the World

The largest screen, the Townsquare 3D screen, positioned prominently at Yas Mall, was specifically chosen to showcase promotional digital content due to its impactful location.









At Al Qana

Situated along the stunning Rabdan Canal, Al Qana is a vibrant entertainment and leisure destination with spectacular waterfront views in the heart of Abu Dhabi. Offering a unique collection of attractions including waterside eateries, cinema experiences, Middle east's largest aquarium, a yacht marina, first-of- its-kind fitness and wellness facility, retail boutiques, coffee shops, restaurants, virtual reality & sports arena and landscaped community spaces to encourage social interaction.

Our outdoor campaign at Al Qana included a network of 8 double sided totems strategically positioned to cover all areas of Al Qana as well as a "Curve Screen", one of the largest 3D screens in Abu Dhabi. The campaign ran for over 2 weeks leading up to the event.

ADNOC Petrol Stations

46 Digital screens were selected across ADNOC Petrol stations in Abu Dhabi These petrol stations are visited by more than 7 million people every month and stay at the petrol station for average duration of approximately 10 minutes. The promotional campaign ran for over 2 weeks leading up to the event.

Both accounts were meticulously managed with tailored posting strategies designed to resonate with their specific audiences. The WorldSkills Asia organization's social media accounts focused on delivering content targeting all member countries and the international participants. Simultaneously, for ACTVET's social media accounts, a localized approach was adopted, engaging with the community, and providing insights into the unique aspects of hosting the event in Abu Dhabi. The dual-strategy approach enabled a targeted engagement.


WorldSkills Asia's accounts, with a global outlook, reached a diverse international audience meanwhile ACTVET's accounts connected more intimately with the local community, garnering substantial regional engagement, which together led to reach of 1,867,002 impressions which validates the success of the dual-strategy approach.

The WorldSkills Asia organisation social media accounts included: Facebook, Twitter, Instagram whereas ACTVET's social media accounts included: Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Telegram channel, Snapchat, and YouTube.

The content was crafted to convey key messages through multiple campaigns on both the accounts, sharing essential details about the event, focussing on international participants, showcasing the global camaraderie, variety of skills, and spotlighting Abu Dhabi's hospitality. This involved a collective sum of 1147 posts on both accounts, including images, videos, and stories, leading to the acquisition of new followers —1500+ on ACTVET's accounts and 500+ on WorldSkills Asia's accounts.

During the event, we experienced active engagement on our social media platforms from participants worldwide. The live broadcast of the opening and closing ceremonies garnered a total of 10,766 views, with the highest viewership coming from the UAE, Chinese Taipei, Malaysia, India, and Europe.

Collaboration with Influential Accounts: A Global Spotlight

In our pursuit of extending the reach of WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2023, we strategically partnered with well-known official accounts, amplifying the event's visibility across diverse platforms. One of the leading accounts in UAE and representing the Abu Dhabi government is @ admediaoffice with more than 700,000 followers across all social media channels. The media office contributed to the event by generating unique content and capturing the competition's ambiance through various social media tools. Additionally, they provided event coverage, disseminated press releases, and news to both local and international publications, extended invitations to government entities, and actively encouraged their attendance at the event.

The event was also promoted through a media and news platform UAE Barg (@uae_barg_en), achieving a total of 41,573 views and a reach of 25,790 through Instagram posts. Additionally, Barg's Instagram story coverage garnered 95,256 views, reaching 98,256 and accumulating a total of 98,256 impressions.

Furthermore, our partnerships involved active participation with notable organizations like WorldSkills International, whose official accounts reached a global audience in the millions thereby promoting a sense of worldwide community, UNESCO – UNEVOC, and local government entities, serving a unique avenue for targeting our audiences.

Another key factor in creating the social buzz was inviting social media influencers, where they shared the promo video with their followers and covered the event, congratulating the winners. Notably, both Master of Ceremonies for appointed to host the Opening and Closing Cermonies were social media influencers and content creators. They took their viewers behind the scenes, showcasing rehearsal and preparation, a smart move to captivate the audience's attention.

Additionally, to add to the social buzz, we involved over 30 participating countries by providing them with a media toolkit, comprising promo videos, pictures, event profiles, information about Abu Dhabi, key social media accounts, and event hashtags.

News everywhere

PR and news coverage played a crucial role in highlighting this international event. ACTVET entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with EMIRATES NEWS AGENCY - WAM, designating them as the primary media partner for the event. WAM played a crucial role in promoting the event not only within the UAE but globally. This involved the dissemination of 84 press releases translated into 18 languages, along with the sharing of 95 pictures and 6 main videos, encompassing interviews and general information, across 7 countries.

The news publications utilized various platforms, including print newspapers, and digital channels such as websites and social media, as well as WhatsApp, to circulate news and content related to the event. Industry-specific publications also featured the event in dedicated articles and posts, ensuring that the buzz surrounding WorldSkills Abu Dhabi 2023 reverberated not only within the competition's ecosystem but also among broader audience.

The media coverage included major television and news outlets, Oloum Al Dar, a leading media house, had 4 extensive coverages on Abu Dhabi TV, reaching an impressive audience of 650,000

viewers. The momentum continued with Emirates TV, where a single coverage captured the attention of 120,000 viewers. Arabia TV provided coverage that resonated with a staggering 2,000,000 viewers, while SAUDIA TV added another 200,000 to the growing audience.

Al Etihad News contributed significantly with 8 news coverages, collectively reaching 150,000 subscribers. Meanwhile, Al Khaleej News, Al Bayan News, Al Watan News, and Al Fajer News each played their part, accumulating 5, 3, 3, and 3 news coverages, respectively, and reaching a combined audience of 930,000. The media coverage culminated with a total of over 4 million subscribers across various platforms.
